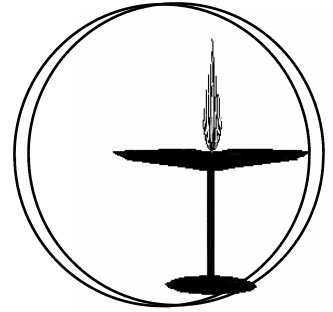

WHAT WE'RE REALLY DOING AT UUFBR

Earlier this fall, at the LREDA (Liberal Religious Educators Association) fall conference in New Mexico, I was introduced to a slogan that particularly resonated with me. The slogan was a reminder to all congregations that religious education is not a separate part of congregational life, but in reality is what congregational life is about. The slogan: **“Faith development is all we do; Unitarian Universalism is all we teach; and the congregation is the curriculum.”**

I could go through the exegesis for you, but I think I'll let you put your brains to work and think about each of these three statements on your own. For me the most interesting aspect is the application: what does it mean at UUFBR? To me it means that it's time for UUFBR to acknowledge the “lifespan” nature of religious education by re-naming it as an integrated **“lifespan faith development”** program.

It is easy, convenient, and somewhat logical to separate education into what we do for children (similar to regular academic education) and everything else (a hodgepodge of offerings). However, that division doesn't serve us well:

- 1 - It isolates children from their best role models (or is there someone else you'd rather have our children grow up to be like, O ye elders of UUFBR??).
- 2 - It isolates the families with growing children from those who could be mentors and would certainly be supporters (how many parents need reassurance that we're doing a good job? All of us!).
- 3 - And it isolates those whose children are grown from young people who could love them, admire them, and appreciate their involvement (adopt-a-grandparent, anyone?).
- 4 - It also deprives adults of the chance to learn by doing, playing, and having fun (what adult is enjoying life too much?).

The truth of this “faith development” slogan came home to me during our congregational visioning workshop, when religious education was such an important element. I know we were using the term in its broader sense, not limiting it to classroom time for children. And that is a very good sign. To me it means that our congregation recognizes the need for an integrated view of this element of religious community. During the budget process, we will be translating this integrated view into an integrated program, and allocating the resources to support it.

What an interesting time to be involved in our formal religious education program for children- just when it's poised to overflow into a lifelong program that integrates formal classes and experiential opportunities, multigenerational programs and generational time, Fellowship-based and community aspects. And what a perfect time to be looking for a new professional minister or director of religious education! In this process we are truly developing our faith, teaching Unitarian Universalism to each other, and being our own curriculum – it is all we do!

The UU Service Committee's *Guest at Your Table* program supports many causes including:

- Rights in Humanitarian Crisis – In disasters and wars, people are affected differently. Their race, gender, class and other characteristics determine whether or not they will be able to rebuild their lives. UUSC's Rights in Humanitarian Crises Program helps to ensure that all people have the chance to recover.
- Civil Liberties Program – partners with organizations around the world working to defend the rights and freedoms that protect individual citizens from government abuses.
- Economic Justice Program – economic justice is essential for securing basic human rights, alleviating local and global poverty, and achieving a more peaceful and just world. The UUSC embraces a vision of economic human rights, recognizing that workers' rights are human rights.
- Environmental Justice Program- promotes and defends the human right to water. The human right to water entitles everyone to sufficient, safe, acceptable, physically accessible and affordable water for personal and domestic use.
- Learn by Doing –JustJourneys are educational travel experiences that focus on human-rights and social-justice, issues. JustWorks camps are short-term projects that help volunteers examine and understand the root causes and damaging effects of injustice.
