Worship Co-Lab



Hello! My name is Rachael Hayes, and I am UUFBR's new ministerial intern. I just graduated in May from Union Theological Seminary in New York City. My concentration for my Master of Divinity degree is Preaching and Worship.

For my master's thesis, I did a project in collaborative worship. With an interfaith crew of six seminarians, we took turns planning the services for each other and whoever else might show up. After each service, we reflected on how it worked in sound, space, time, text, prayer, and people.

Co-Lab: Collaborative, laboratory, explorative, experimental worship.

Something amazing happens when we make meaning together. We discover that everyone has something to say and is qualified to say it. We test our truths and our limits by publicly holding them in worship. We discover that this project of life is more meaningful—and more fun—than we would have guessed when we discover that truth and play can go together. It changes lives.

I am excited to continue this project at UUFBR, both to enrich the worship life of the fellowship and to learn how it may be adapted for use in a congregation. I hope to publish the evolution of this project as a manual for small group ministry and alternative worship so that more people may participate in Co-Lab worship, in UU settings and interfaith settings, so that more people can experience a worship where everyone has a voice, where we explore the balance between freedom and responsibility in the search for truth and meaning, where we explore the balance of accepting one another as we are and encouraging one another to move deeper into that search.

At UUFBR, this will take the form of Co-Lab worship services on the **second Wednesday of every month** beginning in October. After the service, I will facilitate a talkback session so that we can share what we experienced and what we learned from participating in the service. Everyone is welcome to stay for the talkback.

Our Sunday morning spiritual gathering is very important to so many of us. We share ideas, companionship, joys, sorrows and support. Many members have expressed a desire to see more programs and services offered at UUFBR. This Fellowship is a very special place, and people want to be here and feel that powerful sense of centeredness and well-being more often! Toward that end, Harris, our minister, has long been considering creating a wellness center, a place that can nourish body and soul.

This past spring, Erica Siegel, a UU member and practitioner of Acupuncture and Traditional Chinese Medicine, met with Harris and the Board of Trustees. She presented a plan for housing a community acupuncture clinic at UUFBR. The Board gave Erica their support to run a low cost clinic for those who would like to benefit from acupuncture. After much thought and planning, the doors open October 1, 2017!

Fees are on a sliding scale of \$15-\$50 per treatment, with each patient deciding what he or she can afford for each treatment. There is an initial consultation fee of \$10. The traditional model which prevails in the United States – that of charging patients up to \$200 for private acupuncture in a spa-like setting, has made Chinese medicine unaffordable for most. Community acupuncture opens the door to the many who could benefit from treatment, but who could not previously afford it. Moreover, the pricing structure allows many people to come very frequently, which is how acupuncture works best.

This is a professional clinic, located in the Rockberger room. Erica has a Masters in Oriental Medicine (4-year program) from Pacific College of Oriental Medicine (New York City), and has been practicing acupuncture and herbal medicine for 11 years. Treatments are given in a community setting, which means that a handful of patients will relax and receive acupuncture in the same room at the same time. This community method allows cost to stay low for both practitioner and patient. After a private consultation with Erica, patients move to a massage table or comfortable recliner where they can receive a treatment and then relax and heal in a quiet, serene environment.

Acupuncture and herbal medicine can be used to treat a wide variety of health complaints, either as a stand-alone treatment or in conjunction with other modalities. Many people simply enjoy that acupuncture makes them feel good, and allows them to better cope with stress and emotional issues.

THE ZEN TEACHINGS OF CATS & DOGS

Sunday October 22 in the Parker Room, Main Building
from 12:45—3:15 PM.



Cary Bayer, a New York- and Florida-based life coach who's worked with Oscar-winners Alan Arkin (*Little Miss Sunshine*) and Pietro Scalia (*JFK*, *Black Hawk Down*), Emmy-winners comedian David Steinberg (*Academy Awards presentations*) and Judy Henderson (*Homeland*), and Quality Inns, will teach a class to help people learn how to enliven qualities of Enlightenment embodied by cats and dogs.

Bayer will draw from his books *Zen Teachings of Cats and Dogs* and *Zen Teachings of Animals* to help people more deeply awaken five key qualities of Enlightenment embodied by cats and dogs. The workshop leader, who's lived with different cats since 1981, said there are more than 171 million cats and dogs that Americans have taken into their homes to raise. These little buddhas, who demonstrate many of the qualities that the world's great teachers have taught about the nature of Enlightenment, have, in turn, taken us under their wings...um, make that paws.

In this class, Cary provides tools that students can practice daily (he calls it Pet Yoga) to master those five important qualities of Enlightenment. Pet Yoga helps transform our consciousness from low levels of fear where our tail is between our legs to the place where it's wagging all the time, the state of consciousness called Feline Groovy. The cost for the class is \$25.

Thanks for cleaning up after the hurricane !

We on the finance committee would like to say thank you to all those volunteers that gave of their time and energy to prepare for the hurricane, return our buildings to a function order, clean the parking lot and UUFBR grounds.

There were folks that prepared our buildings and grounds. They lifted all of our computers off the floor and covered them with plastic. Tables and chairs from the patio and toys from the playground were moved inside our buildings. UUFBR was buttoned down for the hurricane.

There was another crew that returned our buildings back to a functional space. There was another crew that picked up tree branches, swept the parking lots and made them safe for us to have a service after the hurricane.

We have an estimate of \$1,800 to remove the fallen trees and clean all of our parking spaces and driveways. Today, it has been decided, that for the safety of our members and volunteer workers, that for about \$600 – 700, we can safely have the fallen trees cut down and wood stacked near the street for pickup.

This effort of all our volunteers will have made a real savings of about \$1,100 - \$1,200. This work is a grand effort and hopefully also brings us together as a tighter community.

There have been some angels that have made donations to help pay for the tree removal. Thank you so very much ! This has not fixed our budget issues, but it has prevented unexpected expenses from making our financial picture more difficult.

What is Healing Justice?

At our last Healing Justice meeting, I learned that not everyone knows what Healing Justice is and how we function at UUFBR. As I looked over the congregation this past week, I realized why. Many of the faces in the congregation are of people who were not part of UUFBR when we started.

So here is the brief story of Healing Justice---

When do we meet? Healing Justice meets monthly throughout the year. Watch for dates and times.

Why do we meet? We meet to find ways to achieve our goals: 1. Education about and advocacy for those who experience racial injustices. 2. Outreach activities to both the UUFBR congregation and our neighboring community

How long have we existed at UUFBR? Since 2014. In Fall 2013, as a 2nd Hour class under the leadership of the Rev. Harris Riordan, we read Michelle Alexander's book, *The New Jim Crow: Mass Incarceration in the Age of Colorblindness*. We continued to meet to address the racial injustices chronicled in Alexander's book.

What kinds of things have we done?

- Sponsored films and discussions highlighting issues related to racism.
- Sponsored worship service speakers and sermons to heighten awareness of racial justice issues in our nation and community.
- Participated in community events focused on building peace and interracial understanding. Examples? Martin Luther King day, DISC discussion groups, and most recently, Black Lives Matter Palm Beach County.
- Led summer services related to Healing Justice.
- Supported three UUFBR congregational meetings in Fall 2015 into January 2016 where we deliberated whether or not to hang a banner to support the Black Lives Matter movement. The congregation said no, but as a congregation we continue to dialogue about racism as Healing Justice continues its work.
- Presented workshops titled *Dialogue Racism* in 2016 and 2017 featuring leaders, Cherry Steinwender and Lucy McLaughlin, from The Center for the Healing of Racism, Houston, Texas. Workshop participants included folk from both UUFBR and the South Florida area. The UUFBR Endowment Committee funded workshops.

Please join us as we continue to work to dismantle racism in its many forms: systematic, institutional, overt, covert as well as insidious white privilege, to name a few. We can't fully resolve the issues inherent in racism, but we can made positive contributions by enacting our 7 Principles. The UUA has recognized how it has contributed to perpetuating white privilege and is taking steps to correct those actions. Dismantling racism is a long hard journey. Let's figure out what we can do. We need all of us to participate in this work.

On-going

P.E.A.C.E. People Engaged in Active Community Efforts. A congregation-based community organization charged with the mission of effectively fighting injustices in the communities of PB County.

Family Promise. A network of area congregations who open their doors to families in need. Families receive hospitality from congregations for a week, with each family sleeping in a private area. The program is to bring temporary shelter, meals, and support to these families.

Remembering Their Names. Each quarter during worship we remember the names of coalition forces killed in conflict abroad. Creating peace and justice in the world calls us to explore the power of peace in ourselves. In December 2004 we began a meditation practice. With this ritual we stretch our hearts so that together we might find a path to peace.
